

Dear Friends:

It is rather difficult to believe this summer marks my fifth season as Executive Director (and my seventh in an administrative capacity with the Festival). When Genette Free-

man gave me the "keys" back in August 2017, she jokingly mentioned that she'd done it all everything from accepting the largest of donations to cleaning the filthiest of bathrooms. Well, I can't say she was wrong! But, all jokes aside, no one of us could have anticipated the unique challenges brought on by the past 2.5 years, in particular. This chapter has challenged our organization (and me) in ways unimaginable.

In my 2020 "From the Executive Director" letter, I wrote:

"The hills of Waimea will sadly be a bit quieter this season. However, we must remind ourselves that the beauty of our song is more thoughtfully defined by the space between the notes themselves. Embracing that silence can offer the most satisfying moment of reflection an ounce of clarity for a world in dire need of a brief intermission."

And with that, our brief intermezzo has concluded. We have paused. We have reflected. We have reconsidered the ways in which we do what we do. And thus begins the next chapter for HPAF— a chapter full of new initiatives, exciting projects, and limitless artistic discoveries.

Our biggest undertaking this season is generously underwritten by the State of Hawai'i and Hawaii Tourism Authority. Thanks to the support of a \$50,000 grant, we are proud to launch our new Hawaiian Cultural Initiative. As per the work associated with this project, we have rewritten our curriculum to support educational enrichment activities which honor various elements of Hawaiian music, history, language, and culture. Furthermore, we will come together to celebrate *The Spirit of Hawai'i* at the Fairmont Orchid on Thursday, June 30 at 7pm. I hope you will join us as we honor the rich culture of Hawai'i in this transcendent season opener with performances by Hawane Rios (HPAF Alumna), Blayne Asing, Kaulu Amaral with Pomai Brown and Friends, and Hālau Ka'eaikahelelani. All proceeds raised from this concert will support HPAF scholarships for local underserved students.

For the first time since 2019, we are overjoyed to present a full slate of 20 concerts, fully-staged productions, and educational programs. This season also begins a new partnership with our friends at Kahilu Theatre. We will spend a significant portion of the summer "in residence" for our productions of *As One, Orpheus in the Underworld,* and *Hair.* This residency allows us to further expand the quality of our offerings and work more carefully to bring high quality music education and cultural experiences to the local community in one of our most cherished Island venues.

Since last July, my team and I have worked tirelessly to engage the most diverse faculty and participant roster in the history of the Festival. In addition, we awarded nearly \$110,000 in scholarships and financial aid to 85% of our participants (shattering all previous records). Finally, we have programmed groundbreaking repertoire that will challenge societal norms and afford us the opportunity to use our art form as a vehicle for discussion and social impact.

Whether you see me collecting a donation, scrubbing a toilet, or conducting our upcoming production of *Hair*, please feel free to stop by and say hello. Since I first joined the HPAF Ohana as a participant in 2009, I have seen this organization continue to reach new heights. And this season will be no exception, my friends. We are bigger, better, and braver because of each of you. Mahalo for your unwavering trust and support.

ABOUT HAWAI'I PERFORMING ARTS FESTIVAL



ow in its 18th season, Hawaii Performing Arts Festival brings some of the most talented young musicians from Hawaii, the U.S., Canada, Australia, Asia, Africa, the Middle East, South America, and Europe to Hawaii Island each summer for intensive study and performance training, affording young artists the opportunity perform with professional musicians under the guidance of some of the world's most established teachers and mentors. The results are astonishing.

During the 2019 Summer Festival, more than 20 concerts and staged performances were presented, giving the students invaluable experience and privilege of appearing on stage with some of the top musical artists in their field. All performances were produced at various venues around the Big Island. The 2020 Virtual Festival featured 14 free concerts, masterclasses, and special events, featuring a world-class roster of artists, available to audiences both locally and internationally. Last summer, HPAF featured four live concerts as part of the 2021 Summer Festival, *The Journey Back.*

During the fall, winter, and spring months, HPAF offers special performances to help support scholarships for aspiring young artists to attend the festival each summer. Previous high season performances have included Jake Shimabukuro, Ofra Harnoy, Stanford University's Fleet Street Singers, and An Evening at the Stork Club — an HPAF original production.

AWAIIAN CULTURAL INITIATIVE

This summer, HPAF is thrilled to launch its Hawaiian Cultural Initiative. Thanks to the generous support of the State of Hawai'i and Hawaii Tourism Authority, HPAF will offer a series of classes aimed to strengthen faculty, staff, and students' engagement and understanding of the rich culture of Hawai'i. Led by local faculty members, this summer's curriculum will include kukui and Lāi'ī lei making, the history of Hawai'i, Hawaiian language, and hula instruction. It is the aim of this initiative to provide a greater sense of community and appreciation for the native land and its people.

In addition, the Festival will celebrate the start of its 18th season with a tribute to the rich culture of Hawai'i during a special performance at the Hawane Rios (HPAF Alumna) and headliner during The Spirit of Hawai'i.

EDUCATIONAL ENGAGEMENT

HPAF's commitment to music education reaches far beyond the training of our participants. This season, a number of our developing singers will bring a special performance of arias, songs, and duets to the Waikoloa Summer Camp for K-8 students. The goal of this experience is to introduce culturally, geographically, and economically disadvantaged students to world opera and musical theatre performance.

Our "Behind the Curtain Series" will welcome audience members before the Sunday matinee performances of *As* *One, Orpheus in the Underworld,* and *Hair.* These pre-curtain discussions will offer an opportunity for members of the community to engage with HPAF artists on thematic material and the process of bringing an artistic vision to the stage.


NYLA WATSON

AIDAN WHARTON



JUSTIN JOHN MONIZ* – Executive Director | Music Director/Conductor, Hair | Co-Chair, The Encrantz Vocal Fellowship Program

A recipient of the Yamaha Corporation's 2022 Top 40 Music Educator Award. Dr. Justin John Moniz serves as Associate Director of Vocal Performance and Coordinator of Vocal Pedagogy at New York University's (NYU) Steinhardt School. At NYU, Moniz leads the graduate vocal pedagogy program and teaches courses in pedagogical theory, practice, and

applied voice. In addition, he directs the DownBeat Award-winning NYU Pop/Rock Ensemble. Since August 2017, Moniz has served as Executive Director of HPAF. His innovative programming has earned HPAF both global recognition and multiple awards from the National Opera Association, The American Prize, and BroadwayWorld. Throughout Moniz's administrative tenure, he has won the organization over a million dollars in public and private grants, increased the annual operating budget by nearly 40%, and yielded the highest student enrollment in the festival's 18-year history. Prior to his work as Executive Director, Moniz served as Associate Executive Director, Assistant Artistic Director, and Vocal Faculty Chair. A three-time winner of The American Prize in Vocal Performance, Moniz has sung over 90 roles with companies including Opera Grand Rapids, Utah Festival Opera & Musical Theatre, Sarasota Opera, Florida Grand Opera, The Columbus Philharmonic, DreamCatcher Theatre, and more. His debut solo album, Along the Way (2021), is available on all streaming platforms. Dr. Moniz holds four degrees from Florida State University, the University of Miami, and SUNY Potsdam, and certifications from Harvard Business School, Duke University, and the National Academy of Sports Medicine (NASM). He has received young alumni awards from all three of his alma maters and was previously named one of Florida State University's Notable Noles, University of Miami's 30 Under 30, and a SUNY Potsdam Rising Star. As a voice teacher, researcher, and NASM Certified Personal Trainer, Moniz's current research focuses on identifying the parallels between the worlds of voice science and sports medicine, more specifically concerning vocal load, efficiency, and sustainability. His article, "Regulating Vocal Load in High Impact Production," was recently published in the May/June 2022 issue of the Journal of Singing. For more information: justinjohnmoniz.com / @jj moniz

VAL UNDERWOOD — Artistic Director | Co-Chair, The Encrantz Vocal Fellowship Program | Vocal Faculty

Val Underwood is Artistic Director of Hawaii Performing Arts Festival. He is distinctive for his equal skill as a pianist (the LA Times described his playing as "exquisite") and as a voice teacher. He has trained a number of successful concert pianists, as well as singers who appear with companies world-wide. As a pianist he has performed in concert with

principle players of the New York and Los Angeles Philharmonics and with artists such as Mitchell Lurie, Eudice Shapiro, Glenn Dicterow, Ofra Harnoy, Gary Gray, Jeannine Altmeyer, Jennifer McGregor, Ricky Ian Gordon and many others. His film and television performances include the Masterpiece production of Willa Cather's The Song of the Lark. After directing programs in The Strawberry Creek Festival and The Adriatic Chamber Music Festival, he co-founded Hawaii Performing Arts Festival in 2004 with his close friend, Genette Freeman. Hawaii Performing Arts Festival has hosted hundreds of students from all over the world and an acclaimed faculty of performers and teachers. His teaching career has taken him regularly to Los Angeles, New York and London. He guest lectures and conducts master classes at schools throughout the country. He counts among his own most influential teachers Rita Hutcherson, Reginald Stewart, Dora Zaslavsky, and Arminda Canteros (student of Vincenzo Scaramuzza) in piano and Ernest St. John (Jack) Metz and Martial Singher in voice. Early in his career, he had opportunities to accompany in the studios of some of the great singers/ teachers of the century - Lotte Lehmann, George London, Rose Bampton and Martial Singher. He is honored that a number of his colleagues and former students have been esteemed faculty members of Hawaii Performing Arts Festival.



SCOTT SKIBA — Assistant Artistic Director | Chair, Stage Directing Fellowship Program | Stage Director, Orpheus in the Underworld

Award-winning stage director Scott Skiba has led more than 80 new productions with companies including Indianapolis Opera, Pensacola Opera, Opera Tampa, Toledo Opera, Natchez Festival of Music, Opera Grand Rapids, and Mobile Opera. Scott serves as Executive Artistic Director for Cleveland Opera Theater and Production Director for Opera Western Reserve.

Scott launched {NOW} Fest, Cleveland Opera Theater's annual festival to create, develop, and produce new opera, and he serves on the Chamber Opera Composition Committee for the National Opera Association. Scott's work includes directing and producing interdisciplinary collaborations in alternative and site-specific venues including Sweets By Kate (Marble City Opera) performed in Sugar Mama's Bakery Knoxville; The New Opera Project in collaboration with Interlochen Arts Academy, Parallel 45 Theatre Company, and Inside Out Gallery in Traverse City; and the *iLyric project* - installation of nine operas throughout historic Arezzo, Italy in collaboration with the ICASTICA Festival. Scott is Director of Opera Studies for Baldwin Wallace Conservatory, where he has directed numerous productions including *Pelléas* + *Mélisande* (Winner of The American Prize for Opera Performance, and The Charles Nelson Reilly Prize in Stage Direction) and The Dialogues of the Carmelites (1st Place winner NOA Collegiate Opera Production Competition). Previous appointments include Executive Director of the Oberlin in Italy opera training program, Instructor of Voice and Opera Theater, Interlochen Arts Academy; and Associate Instructor of Voice, Indiana University Jacobs School of Music. Scott devised and directed multiple projects to continue artistic collaboration throughout the pandemic including Opera ON DEMAND for the Curtis Institute of Music, A Taste of Traviata - a cinematic adaptation of La Traviata for Opera Western Reserve; and Operas in Place, nine new short operas by World-renowned composers and librettists in collaboration with Baldwin Wallace Conservatory, Cleveland Opera Theater, and On Site Opera in NYC. Other recent productions include Alcina, and Le nozze di Figaro (Baldwin Wallace), Don Giovanni (Indianapolis Opera), and the World-premiere production of La Casa de Bernarda Alba (Baldwin Wallace / Cleveland Opera Theater). RACHEL E. COPELAND – General Manager | Chair, **Vocal Faculty**

Rachel E. Copeland continues to receive acclaim as a "revelation with her coloratura soprano leaping easily to impossible heights!" She is a sought after artist combining her crystalline voice with her compelling and energetic stage presence. Ms. Copeland recently debuted at Avery Fisher Hall as the soprano soloist in Mozart's Coronation Mass to rave reviews as well as performances with the Brussels Chamber Orchestra in a concert of arias and duets. Other career highlights include the Contessa in Mozart's Le

Nozze di Figaro with Cleveland Opera Theater, Frasquita in Bizet's Carmen with San Diego Opera, Micaela in Peter Brook's Le tragédie de Carmen with Indianapolis Opera, and Woglinde in Wagner's Das Rheingold and first nymph in Dvorak's Rusalka with North Carolina Opera. She returned to Apollo's Fire, the Cleveland Baroque Orchestra in 2013 to great acclaim as the Queen of the Night in Mozart's The Magic Flute, including a national broadcast and her debut at Severance Hall, the prestigious home to the Cleveland Symphony Orchestra. Other considerable performances include Ms. Copeland's appearances as Zdenka in Strauss's Arabella, Musetta and Mimì in La bohème, Lauretta in Puccini's beloved Gianni Schicchi, Lucia in Donizett's Lucia di Lammermoor, Juliette in Gounod's Romèo et Juliette. Adele in J. Strauss' Die Fledermaus, Mabel in The Pirates of Penzance, and Papagena in The Magic Flute. Internationally, Ms. Copeland has performed the roles of Donna Elvira in Mozart's Don Giovanni and Adina in Donizetti's L'elisir d'amore. Recent engagements included a world premiere workshop with Cleveland Opera Theatre, a world premiere with Penn State Opera Theater, and a role and company debut of Agueda in Mayo, Bisperas ng Liwanag in the Philippines (cancelled due to COVID). In addition to the operatic stage, Ms. Copeland has been praised for her "elegant and smooth tone" in oratorio and symphonic works. As a frequent performer with the Helena Symphony (MT), Ms. Copeland has most recently sung the role of Eve in Hadyn's The Creation and as the soprano soloist for Bach's Mass in B minor as well as the St. Matthew Passion. Other notable engagements were with Apollo's Fire for Handel's Messiah, The Choral Society of Durham (NC) as the soprano soloist in Barber's Prayers of Kierkegaard, and the soprano soloist in Hadyn's "Lord Nelson's Mass" and "Missa belle tempori." Dr. Copeland began an appointment at Penn State School of Music as a member of the Voice Department in Fall, 2018, and now also serves as the Associate Director, Director of Graduate Programs. She previously was on the faculty of East Carolina University School of Music where she served as the Associate Director (2016 - 2018), the Coordinator of Graduate Studies (2014 - 2018), and a member of the Voice Faculty (2011 - 2018). In both academic years 2017 - 18 and 2014 - 2015, Dr. Copleand was nominated for the Robert Wright Alumni Excellence in Teaching Award at East Carolina University. Many of Dr. Copeland's students have received awards, scholarships, assistantships, and are featured in principle roles at the undergraduate and graduate level at prestigious music schools like Boston Conservatory, Indiana University, Florida State University, Oberlin Conservatory of Music, and the University of North Texas, in addition to sharing the stage with luminaries of the field like Natalie Dessay to Vanessa Williams. Dr. Copeland is frequently sought after as a master class technician both nationally and abroad and has been on the faculty of the Cornish American Song Institute in Falmouth, England since 2016 and Cantos para hermanar al mundo in Torréon, Mexico in 2019. During the summers of 2011 and 2012, Dr. Copeland was a faculty member of Musica nelle Marche in Urbania, Italy. Administratively, Dr. Copeland serves at General Manager for the Hawaii Performing Arts Festival and has previously served in the positions of Program Director (2017) as well as the Operations Manager (2011 – 2016) for Oberlin in Italy in Arezzo, Italy. Dr. Copeland holds the Doctor of Music degree in Vocal Performance with a minor in Music History from Indiana University; the Master of Music degree in Voice Performance from Baylor University; and the Bachelor of Music Education degree in Choral Conducting from Baylor University.



SHAYNA LEAHY – Artistic Administrator

Shayna Leahy currently serves as the Artistic Administrator for HPAF after spending two summers as the Director of Production. She most recently was the stage director for Wichita Grand Opera's 2019 production of *Carmen*, having previously directed productions of *Madama Butterfly*, *Turandot, Otello, II Trovatore*, and *Aida* for them. She made her directing debut with New York City Opera in September

2018, with a production of *II Barbiere di Siviglia* in Bryant Park. Her productions are hailed as being "deeply felt, and deeply moving" with emphasis on "fine acting as well as strong singing" (Wichita Eagle). Her work has been featured on Kansas Public TV. She has also served as Assistant Director of Martina Arroyo's Prelude to Performance Program in New York, was faculty for the Opera Academy of the Midwest, and is currently the Director of Vocal Studies at Highland Community College, where she has led a nationally-recognized opera education initiative in collaboration with Wichita Grand Opera. His "rich, nuanced baritone" (Columbus Underground) has held center stage in performances at The Glimmerglass Festival, Opera Carolina, First Coast Opera, Toledo Opera, Opera Saratoga, Sarasota Opera, Cedar Rapids Opera, El Palacio de Bellas Artes, Opera Company of Brooklyn, The IN Series, Carnegie Hall, The Kennedy Center,

Alexandra Enyart has been called "one of Chicago's greatest operatic gifts" (Chicago Theatre Review) and "a podium talent to watch"(Chicago Classical Review). She's performed with Opera Columbus, Australian Contemporary Opera Company, Opera Orlando, and many others around the country and globe. She has served as a Chicago Sinfonietta Fellow and as a "Turn the Spotlight" fellow with Chicago Opera Theatre music

director, Lidiya Yankovskaya. In 2017 Alexandra won the CODA conducting competition and in 2018 she won CCM's Mozart Overture Conducting Competition. Pianist Ronny Michael Greenberg has been heard in opera houses and concert halls around the world. Most recently he went on tour with Tenor Pene Pati in Italy and New Zealand performing in Milan, Florence, San Bonifacio, Auckland, Tauranga and Waikato. Chan Mi Jean is the Lecturer in Music at the University of Tennessee at Martin, where she specializes in Collaborative Piano. DEBRA MCGEE — Choreographer, *Hair*

Debra moved to Hawaii island in 2011 after performing, teaching, and choreographing in NY and MN Twin Cities for over two decades. She received her Bachelor of Fine Arts in Dance from Marymount Manhattan College in N.Y.C. There she performed works by José Limón, Milton Myers, Jeffrey Holder, Louis Falco, Virginia Johnson and Lar Lubovich. Debra is a former member of Garth Fagan Dance and

performed his works nationally and internationally. Thereafter, she began teaching and choreographing again while training vocally at the Eastman School of Music in NY. Thereafter, she returned to MN where she worked with former Alvin Ailey principal's company called TU Dance, performed in numerous musicals and worked as a teaching artist. She has taught and created works at the University of Minnesota, Gustavus Adolphus College, The Cowles Center, Penumbra Theater and St. Paul Conservatory. This is her eighth year as a Lava Roots dancer and a member of the Prince Dance Company on the island of Hawaii for the last several years performing, choreographing collaboratively, and teaching. She currently teaches at Kona Dance and Performing Arts, the Hub in Hawi, Donkey Mill's Fall and Summer Programs, and is an emerging artist with Hawaii State Foundation of Arts and Culture. This is her second season with Hawaii Performing Arts Festival as choreographer and dance educator. She is thrilled to return for yet another fabulous summer season.



JENNIFER MCGREGOR — Vocal Faculty

Jennifer McGregor graduated from the Sydney Conservatorium Opera School and spent three years in music theater performing leading roles in *The Sound of Music, A Funny Thing Happened on the Way to the Forum, Cabaret, The Venetian Twins* and *Candide*. She began her operatic career as one of Richard Bonynge's protégés, singing Ophelia to Sherill Milne's Hamlet. Her *Lucia di Lammermoor* was the

first to be sung in Australia after Dame Joan Sutherland, with whom she worked in *Die Fledermaus* and *Alcina*. She also has an extensive concert repertoire and has worked with conductors such as Richard Bonynge, Simone Young, Charles Mackerras, and Edo de Waart.



MAIKA'I NASH — Vocal Coach

Native Hawaiian pianist and vocal coach, Maika'i Nash, returned home to Hawai'i in 2017 to accept the Head of Music and Director of the Orvis Opera Studio Program positions at the Hawai'i Opera Theatre. In his 20 year absence, Maika'i lived abroad, studying at McGill University in Montréal, at the Schubert Institute of Lieder in Vienna, the Centre for Operatic Studies in Sulmona, Italy, and privately in Paris. He spent the bulk of his career in Toronto and Montréal, working for a number of Canadian opera companies,

McGill University, the University of Toronto, Western University, the Glenn Gould School, and the Royal Conservatory of Music. Always a voracious adventurer, he also spent 2.5 years in Bogotá, Colombia, working as a vocal coach, répétiteur, and pianist throughout the Colombian capital, and in the other major Colombian cities. Now firmly reestablished in Honolulu, Maika'i launched the new performing arts, non-profit group, HI Arts Lab, a company creating experiential moments in music across multiple art forms. The company launched in 2019 to rave reviews and a well attended 3-night run at the Entrepreneur's Sandbox in Honolulu's art district, Kaka'ako and produced an additional 6 experiences throughout the 2019-2020 season to sold-out audiences. Maika'i has performed in a number of renowned masterclass series with international artists that include: Christine Goerke, Barbara Bonney, Elly Ameling, Joan Dornemann, Julius Drake, Edith Wiens, Cynthia Hoffman, Helmut Deutsch, Rudolf Jansen, Robert Holl, Wendy Nielsen, Laura Claycomb & Denise Massé, among others. Growing up in Hawaii, Maika'i studied with Ernest Chang and made his solo debut with the Honolulu Symphony Orchestra when he was 11. As an operatic vocal coach, Maika'i has worked with a number of opera companies throughout Canada, Colombia, and the United States. He has also been engaged as the official collaborative pianist for the Metropolitan Opera Council Auditions for a number of years and has also collaborated and recorded with renowned singers such as Richard Margison, Quinn Kelsey, Audrey Luna, Barry Banks, Mark Doss, Leslie-Ann Bradley & Martha Senn. Maika'i is currently the official pianist for Disney Entertainment for the State of Hawai'i and works with the Hawaii Symphony Orchestra, Manoa Valley Theatre, Diamond Head Theatre, the I'm a Bright Kid Foundation, Gridiron, and is a vocal coach and collaborator with La Sorellanza, a community women's choir in Honolulu.



ANGEL PRINCE — Choreographer, Orpheus in the Underworld

Angel Prince is at her core, a storyteller. Drawing on a life-long interest in human nature and culture, she creates vibrant theatrical realms using the multi-media system of dance. Interdisciplinary in nature, her artistic practice, scholarship, and teaching are situated at the intersection of performance practice and social and environmental issues. She founded Prince Dance Institute in 2004 and Prince Dance Company, a non-profit contemporary

dance organization, in 2007 and has choreographed, directed, and performed over 25 original evening-length works that push thematic boundaries, requiring her audiences to be inspired and challenged. Her creative ideas are rooted in her Hawaii home but are relevant to the world. She has challenged audiences from as close as Hawaii and as far away as New York City and Buenos Aires to think about humanity's place in this world and our relationship and responsibility to ourselves, each other, and our environment. Most recently the company performed My Empty Body Is Full of Stars at the Kahilu Theatre and will be taking this show on a national tour in 2023/24.

Lahela has been involved in Hula for the majority of her life and through the cultural practice of Hula, knowledge and tradition is passed on. 

Kumu Ka'ea and Kumu Kahelelani are lifetime hula dancers having had the opportunity to be traditionally trained from birth by their late mother Sally Kalala Alohikea Toko. Sally was the daughter of Moses Unauna Kuulei Toko Alohikea and Mary Ka'eamoku Kahoonei and was raised in Wainiha, Kaua'i. Sally trained her daughters in the traditional manner and as was customary, she also sent them to other kumu for additional training during their youth. Ultimately, Ka'ea and Kahelelani became students of kumu Nani Lim Yap and graduates of her award winning Hālau Hula Nā Lei 'O Kaholoku.Hālau Ka'eaikahelelani teaches students weekly from 12 months- 80 years young and classes internationally as well. Within the fundamental teachings of Hawaiian arts and practices are centuries of knowledge and understanding essential to the foundation of Hawaiian culture and the sustainability of the islands.



HĀWANE RIOS — Featured Artist, The Spirit of Hawai'i

Hāwane Rios is a Mauna Kea Protector and award winning singer/songwriter from Pu'ukapu, Waimea on the Island of Hawai'i. She was raised from an early age in the traditional art forms of chant and dance of her people which created a strong foundation for her passion of music and songwriting. Rios believes that music is a powerful catalyst for change and is moved to write and sing songs with a healing and unifying

message that she hopes will carry on to the generations to come. Being of Kanaka Maoli (Native Hawaiian), Chamorro, Taino, Portuguese, and English decent, she knows her lineages, cultural traditions, music, advocacy work, and commitment to aloha 'āina (love for the land), connects her to the world and to the collective responsibility we have to care for and protect Mother Earth. Rios has stood on the frontlines of the Protect Mauna Kea Movement and alongside her family as a petitioner in the court system in resistance to the proposed Thirty Meter Telescope for the past 12 years. Her outreach work has taken her to many places and has connected her to many different justice movements rooted in standing up and speaking up for the rights of the land and water. She continues to support the efforts of the movement through her educational outreach work with the non-profit organization, Mauna Kea Education and Awareness and through her artistry as a musician, dancer, and chanter. Kū Kia'i Mauna. Together We Rise.

CATHY YANG — Principal Pianist, Assistant Music Director, *Hair*




